35/25 CITY DIRECTOR REPORT

The City Director highlighted a few points from his report including:-

- i) We have a new vacancy, this time in the Hirael Ward, following the resignation of (former) Councillor Roberts. We are currently waiting for Gwynedd to supply the necessary notices to ascertain if a by-election is required.
- ii) The solar panels have now been fitted to Penrhyn Hall and we are now benefiting from cheaper electricity.
- iii) The City Council are working in conjunction with Storiel and Pontio on a Cyngor Gwynedd led project to redevelop the area outside Storiel, including the former bowling green area, the area on Deiniol Rd side of Storiel and the around the War

Memorial. This project will enhance the cultural heart of the City and make the area more usable.
